| Equator | An imaginary line of latitude which <br> circles the Earth. It lies halfway between <br> the North/ South Poles. It splits Earth <br> into the Northern/ Southern <br> Hemispheres. |
| independent | On its own, not tied to another country |
| Tropic of <br> Cancer | An imaginary line of latitude which <br> circles the Earth. It lies at 23 degrees <br> north. |
| Tropic of <br> Capricorn | An imaginary line of latitude which <br> circles the Earth. It lies at 23 degrees <br> south. |
| landmark | An object or feature that can be <br> recognised from a distance |

Latitude and longitude are a system of lines that are used to describe the location of any place on Earth.

## Latitude

-Lines of latitude run in an east-west direction across the Earth.
Longitude
-Lines of longitude run in a north-south direction. Although lines of longitude and latitude are only imaginary, they exist on maps and atlases to help to show us where different places are.
