Famous Rock and Rollers

Rock and Roll was created in 1950s America after the war and was made to depict happiness and a new life. The name comes from the phrase 'rocking and rolling', which was used by mariners to explain the movement of a ship, which influenced the dance steps. Rock and roll arrived at a time of considerable technological change, soon after the development of the electric guitar, amplifier and microphone, and the 45 rpm
