Musical Texture										Things to do at home			
In music, texture is how the melodic, rhythmic, and harmonic materials are combined in a composition. The thickness of the texture will depend on the number of layers. Texture can be categorised as follows: <i>Monophonic</i> Music has only one melodic line, with no harmony or counterpoint, such as a person whistling a tune. <i>Homophony</i>									Look on <u>www.kidrex.com</u> Watch some Chinese New year celebrations. Has one clearly melodic line, with all other parts providing accompaniment, for example choral music.

Polyphonic

If more than one independent melody is occurring at the same time, the music is polyphonic, such as singing in a round.

Heterophonic

Heterophonic texture is rare in Western music. In heterophony, there is only one melody, but different variations of it are being sung or played at the same time.
