
Topic: Programming – Bee-Bots.

Year: One


Theme: Designing, writing and debugging programmes.

	Key Vocabulary
Algorithm	A clear set of instructions to carry out a task.
Bee-Bot	A small, programmable robot with seven buttons: forwards, backwards, turn right, turn left, go, pause and clear.
Computing code	Words, numbers or symbols that make-up a language used to tell a computer what to do.
Computer program	Instructions that are written for a computer to follow. Also called apps.
Explain	Give clear information to someone else about how to do something.
Explore	Look at or try something new to learn more about it.
Instructions	A set of commands or directions on how to do a task.
Predict	Use information you have to make a guess about what might happen.
Tinker	To play with something to discover what it can (and cannot!) do.
Video	Moving pictures that make up a film, cartoon or animation.
