How should I help my child?

All the hard work your children and the school have put in will be for nothing, unless children **continue to read daily throughout the holidays and work on the targets in their reports**. We know that 6 weeks without learning, practising and reinforcing knowledge just means children will forget what they have learnt (and they do forget things far quicker than they learn them).

Over the summer, support your child by listening to them read every day and talk to them about their book.

Help them to complete the reading challenge and the holiday packs.

- Plain royal blue crew neck t-shirt;
- <u>Plain</u> navy-blue tracksuit top, hoodie or sweatshirt;
- Plain white or black trainers.

Please note, the following will **not be acceptable**:

- Branded clothes (e.g. Nike/adidas), except trainers
- Football kits
- Clothes in other colours

Our PE kit does not need to have the school logo on (unless you want it to) and will be widely available from a range of local retailers. In line with DfE policy, we are actively pursuing uniform options at the lowest possible cost to our families.
