Telling a Story through Music

Music is often used as a narrative device to tell a story. This practice has a long history, going back through operas, epics, poetry, and even to ancient Greece.

First, the musical phrases sound unresolved (like a question), and are then resolved (answered).

timbre	The character or quality of a musical sound or voice	
rhythm	Music's pattern in time.	
phrase	A short unit of music that has a stand-alone meaning.	
recite	Repeat aloud, from memory, to an audience.	
perform	Present to an audience.	
pitch	How high or low a note is.	
duration	How long or short a note is.	
tempo	Refers to the speed of the music.	
dynamics	Describes how loud or quiet music is (volume).	
opera	A form of theatre in which music takes the leading role.	
epic	Music that evokes a definite mood.
