

### Key Vocabulary

<b>noun</b>	A word for a person, place, or thing.
<b>noun phrases</b>	Tells you more about a noun. (very old grandma)
<b>statement</b>	A sentence that states a fact. (It is sunny today.)
<b>question</b>	A sentence to find out information. (What is your name?)
<b>exclamation</b>	A word or phrase expressing emotion. (What a scary movie it was!)
<b>command</b>	A sentence that tells you to do something. (Put on your coat.)
<b>compound</b>	Two words put together to make a new word. (white + board = whiteboard)
<b>suffix</b>	Group of letters added to the end of a word. (s, es, est, er, ing, ed, ly)
<b>adjective</b>	A word used to describe a noun. (tall, beautiful)
<b>adverb</b>	A word that describes a verb. (quickly, quietly, slowly)
<b>tense</b>	Tells us when an action took place. (Present = walking, past = walked)
