Christians

- Canterbury Cathedral, St Winefride's Well and Walsingham are some of the Christian pilgrimage locations in England.
- Christians can choose whether or not to be pilgrims. It is not expected in their faith. They may go on a pilgrimage to develop spiritually and bring them closer to God.
- Christians often pray to saints linked to the pilgrimage site, especially to ask for help in curing a disease.

Money donation box	Offering of fruit Fan called a Chauri.

- Sikhs can choose whether or not to be pilgrims. It is not expected in their faith. They may go on a pilgrimage to develop spiritually and bring them closer to God.
- The Golden Temple in Amritsar is a major Sikh pilgrimage location.
- Sikhs may bathe in the water around the temple, believing that the water can make miracles happen.
- Inside the temple, everyone sits on the floor, to show that all people are equal in the eyes of God, and anyone can hold a service.
- The temple offers food and shelter to the poor.
