- England has the biggest population in the UK. ٠
- The UK is divided into regions. Within these regions are different counties.
- Within counties are villages, towns and cities. The biggest cities in the UK are: London, Birmingham, Leeds, Glasgow and Manchester. (London is the biggest city in Europe)
- Physical features of the England include: The River Thames, The white cliffs of Dover and Land's end.
- Other physical features of the UK include: The Giant's Causeway (Northern Ireland), Ben Nevis (Scotland) and Snowdon (Wales)
