

We have a large Early Years Department with a Nursery and Four Reception Classes. The children in Reception have a class base with their own Teacher and Learning Support Assistant.



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The School Day





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8.50 - Start of the school day.

Children are brought to the classroom and join in with table-top activities until registration at 9.00a.m.

9.00 - Registration.

9.05 - Whole class session.

9.25 - 10.30 Adult-led small group activities; Child-initiated learning. There is a daily phonics session every day.

10. 30- 11.30 - Department Time - Adult-led small group activities; Child-initiated learning.

11.45-12.15 Lunch in the hall.

12.15-12.45- Play time with Key Stage 1

12.45 - Afternoon registration.

12.50 - 1.15 - Shared/Guided reading.

1.40 - 2.40 - Department Time - Child-initiated learning.

2.45 - Story time.

3.00 - Home time. Children are collected from the classroom.

Children will be taught in their class groups and will then spend much of the day in free-flow learning, exploring across the indoor and outdoor environments.

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Your child will be learning through the Early Years Foundation Stage.

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Our Topics

Much of the work we do in Early Years is linked to a theme/ topic:

Autumn Term - All About Me; Celebrations

Spring Term - Journeys; Dinosaurs

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Summer Term -; Minibeasts and Change; Stories and Rhymes

Phonics

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Your child will be learning phonics. We follow the 'Letters and Sounds' programme using Jolly Phonics to help us learn a new letter sound every day. This is a systematic, multi-sensory programme in which children learn an action for each letter sound which helps to make phonics more active and fun (see attached). The children will be grouped for phonics during the Autumn Term.



How to help your child before starting school

- ✤ Name <u>EVERYTHING.</u>
- Practise getting dressed on their own.
- Practise putting on his/her shoes and socks.
- Practise putting on his/her coat.
- Help them to recognise their name.
- Write in lower case letters <u>NOT</u> capitals (see attached handwriting sheet)
- Practise letter sounds <u>NOT</u> names.
- Share stories and books.
- Sing songs and nursery rhymes.

- Early Years staff use observation to continuously assess the children.
- Each child has a 'Learning Journey' book to record their development with examples of what he/she has learnt and achieved.

 We have a target setting day in the Autumn and Spring terms to discuss and set individual targets for your child to work on both at home and at school.
- Observations and assessments throughout the year will lead to the development of your child's Early Years Profile.
- You will receive a written report on your child's development and the characteristics of effective learning at the end of the Reception year.

- To develop as creative and independent learners.

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
