Full Name	Andrew Warhol
Born Died	6 th August 1928 in Pittsburgh ,U.S.A. 22 nd February 1987 in New York City, U.S.A.
Education	When he was 8, he caught a disease that made his arms and legs to sometimes spasm uncontrollably. While recovering his mother taught him to draw. He was a quiet and shy child, but loved drawing and photography. His father had saved money for Andy to go to college, so when he left high school, he went to Carnegie Mellon University to study art.
Art Movement	Pop Art: In 1961 Andy came up with the concept of using mass-produced commercial goods in his art. He called it Pop Art. He would use commercial images and reproduce them over and over. One early example of this was a series on Campbell's Soup cans. Andy often used silkscreen and lithography to create his pictures.
Interesting fact	Warhol was shot three times in the chest by feminist Valerie Solanis and nearly died on June 3, 1968.
