This half-term our topic is 'Bears'. We will be covering the following:

Communication, Language & Literacy:

- Speaking and listening skills; answering and asking questions; following and giving directions.
- Set 2/3 RWI letter sounds; oral blending and segmenting; using phonics to write simple words and captions.
- Writing sentences; writing instructions to make porridge; writing and following instructions for our bear hunt.
- Listening to and joining in with familiar stories and rhymes; following instructions to make porridge; retelling and sequencing stories.
- Reading red words and familiar words; using phonics to read simple words and captions; shared/quided reading.

Mathematics:

- Number rhymes.
- Recognising, ordering and writing numbers from 0-10 and 11-20; ordinal numbers.
- Ordinal numbers 1st to 10th.
- Positional language; directional language following and giving directions.
- Exploring addition as combination of 2 sets.
- Capacity exploring full/empty; comparing vessels.
- Exploring weight of objects heavier and lighter.
- Using non-standard units to measure capacity, weight and length of objects.

Understanding of the World:

- Different types of bears and where they live; similarities and differences.
- Looking after pets.
- Simple maps.
- Festivals Chinese New Year The Year of the Pig.
- Seasonal changes.
- I.C.T. Developing mouse control; using simple tools; programming bee-bots to follow a route; use of easi-speaks and talking tins; using cameras.

Personal, Social & Emotional Development:

- Developing self-help skills and independence.
- Looking after each other and our school environment.
- Care of the environment; care of pets.
- Sharing and helping others.

Expressive Arts & Design:

- Songs and rhymes.
- Painting and drawing; model making; exploring ways of joining materials together.
- Making models using Playdoh and clay.
- Exploring texture and collage using different materials.
- Designing and making a chair for Baby Bear.
- Acting out familiar stories in the role play areas; small world; puppets.
- Role play The Post Office; A Bear 'Look Out'; Chinese take away.

Physical Development:

- Use of simple tools pencils, scissors, rolling pins and cutters; split pins.
- Outdoor play using bikes & trikes; use of climbing apparatus; small bats and balls; bean bags; hoops.
- Developing independence with dressing and self-help skills.
