Churches


- There are many different types of Christianity and so there are lots of different types of church.

• Different types of churches have different names e.g. chapel, meeting room (Quaker).








Buddhist temples

- Buddhist temples are designed to inspire inner and outer peace.
- They symbolize the elements: Fire, Air, Water, Earth and Wisdom. Worship involves chanting, lighting candles and giving offerings to the statue or picture of the Buddha.



Pilgrimages





Buddhist pilgrims travel in simple clothes, like the Buddha. They often wear a cloth gown and sandals and carry a walking stick. They will walk long distances and offer prayer to the Buddha on their pilgrimage or visit shrines and monasteries, where they give gifts to the monks. They also meditate silently to remove their minds from the world around them. Walking and giving are very important aspects of Buddhism.
