<ul> <li>A 'Leavers' Song' will be largely positive.</li> <li>It will typically focus on the past, present and will look ahead to the future.</li> <li>It should evoke memories.</li> <li>They are typically repetitive and memorable.</li> <li>The lyrics should reflect the feelings you might have when leaving school, whether happy or sad or both!</li> <li>The melody should be 'catchy'.</li> <li>The arrangement will add interest to, and support the mood of, a song by using appropriate instruments and effects.</li> <li>A 'Leavers' Song' will typically consist of verses and a chorus.</li> <li>The tempo of the song should be reflective of the lyrics, whilst the melody should match the mood.</li> <li>Writing lyrics can be like writing poetry.</li> <li>A 'Leavers' Song' typically tells a chronological story.</li> <li>All verses should have the same rhyming pattern.</li> </ul>		lyrics	Words to accompany the melody

		arrangement	The process of transforming a collection of musical ideas into a complete track
		verse	A repeated section of a song, featuring new lyrics on each repetition
		chorus	A repeated section that contain the primary lyrical and music concepts
		tempo	The speed of the music
<ul> <li>The rhyming pattern could consist of pairs of lines, alternate lines, or just lines one and four, and five and eight.</li> <li>Melodies can be practised over a four-chord backing track.</li> <li>A chord progression is 'spelt' using Roman numerals.</li> <li>Composition can be recorded via different types of notation.</li> </ul>	Chord progression	A sequence of chords played in succession.	
		tuned	An instrument that can make different notes.
