Colonisation

800.000 km² of rainforest has been lost. The main causes are agriculture, illegal logging, and human encroachment into the forest.

Throughout the 16th-17th centuries, European settlers (mainly from Portugal and Spain, but also the French, Dutch and British) invaded and colonised South America. South Americans still speak European languages today.

Physical Geographical Features

• There is a range of landscapes including the Amazon river, the Atacama desert, Galapagos islands, Machu Pichu, waterfalls and rainforests.
