Year Four

We have been enjoying getting to know the children this week and they have had a terrific start to the term. Mrs Quinton and Mr Chait are this year's teachers, supported by our Learning Support Assistant, Mrs Dasgupta.

For the first half-term, 4Q will have swimming lessons on Tuesdays and football on Fridays. 4C will have Gymnastics on Tuesdays and football on Fridays. All children will need a PE kit with trainers/plimsolls.

In our lessons this term we will be looking at place value, perimeter and times tables in Maths; Ancient Romans in History; the digestive system and teeth in Science; Picasso in Art; discussing families and friends in PSHE; and designing recipes and cooking pizzas in DT.
